Official Sault College Student Administrative Council 2010 - 2011 Executive Board Election Results

(Sault Ste. Marie, ON March 25, 2010) In three days of advanced polling and one Election Day poll, the students of Sault College have elected three of their classmates to represent them and their interests for the 2010 – 2011 Council term. In the process, two candidates were also acclaimed to their positions.

A total of 255 members of the Sault College Student Administrative Council cast ballots to decide which of their peers they chose to represent them in the positions of President, Vice President Programming, and Vice President Communications.

The race for President was won by Alex Marshall, a 2nd year Aviation student who spent the 2009 – 2010 year as the Student Administrative Council's Senate Speaker. Alex received a total of 175 votes to overcome his competitor Amanda Holmberg, a 2nd year Business student and the Council's current VP Communications.

In the race for VP Programming, Tarah Alexander a 2nd year Graphic Design student edged out her competition, Chris Woodcock who is in his 1st year of Child and Youth Worker by a narrow 38 votes.

The third ballot was for the council's VP Communications position. Daniel McCoy, a 1st year Law & Security Administration student fell by only 36 votes to Corey Tucker, a 1st year Fish &

Wildlife Conservation Technician student who has also graduated from the Sault college Chef Training Program.

At the close of nominations for the five executive positions on Thursday March 4th, only one candidate was nominated for the positions of VP Athletics and the Native Student Council (NSC) President. Patrick Hunter, a 2nd year Graphic Design student and the current NSC President was again acclaimed to his position. A 1st year Hotel & Resort Management Program student and member of the Sault College Varsity Curling Team, Jordan Borneman, was acclaimed to the position of VP Athletics

All candidates ran strong campaigns from start to finish. The positivity surrounding those who ran for positions within their student government and those who voted is commendable.
